Architects can help protect the plant

Architecture at the Dublin Institute of Technology in Ireland. Pile is the first recipient of the Louis Campion Scholarship which supports scholars in their pursuit of excellence in the architecture, engineering and construction industry. The scholarship was awarded by her employer, Barbados-based architectural practice, Argo-Development

In the second and final part of an interview with the BARBADOS BUSINESS AUTHORITY, Pile shares what the pandemi has taught her, makes observations about architectural differences between Ireland and Barbados, and shares how she thinks architects can help in the fight against climate change.

How has this opportunity provided by Argo helped with your personal development and what goals do you have in terms of your pursuit of a career in architecture?

Studying in another country has allowed mere introspection. In addition to my professional development, my personal one is still an engoing journey. Situations present themselves where I am constantly working on my self-confidence, communication, and stress management skills. I believe that I have become more receptive and curious. Regarding my pursuit in architecture, in the future, I see myself being amongst the best in the ever-evolving process of building information modeling (B.I.M.) and break conventional barriers of design in Barbados. There is something new to learn daily. In the near future. I see myself assisting young people in their pursuit of architecture in some form or

What are the lessons you have learnt from the pandemic?

The pandemic has put the notion of work-life balance into perspective for me. It is easy to get carried away with tasks and not give yourself ample time to decompress and reset. Health is a big factor in this - if one does not take care of their physical and mental health, who will? For that reason, I started to work out and ommunicate with a counsellor periodically. In addition to this, I've learnt to appreciate little mements more and to reach out to people I care for, to see how they are.

Ireland and Barbados have different climates. How would you describe the differences in architecture and built infrastructure in the two places?

Ireland has a temperate climate with four fistinct seasons versus our tropical one. When I arrived in Dublin, I immediately noticed a great deal of terraced and semi-detached ouses. By terraced, for the unfamiliar, think of rowed housing schemes in Gall Hill, with



brick exteriors for the most part. Many of them possess chimneys for obvious reason. Housing like these tend not to lose as much heat as their detached counterparts because ney share party walls. Regardless, houses in Ireland must be well insulated like a human who layers up from head to toe for winter. Temperatures can reach below zero degrees Celsius on some days. On the contrary. Barbadian homes do need a "jacket", considering how hot it gets year-round. Barbodian vernacular houses prioritise ventilation techniques through the e of patios and louvres, with new hom adding structural stability to the list of musts.

What role do you see architects playing in the battle against climate

This is an increasing topic of discussion within my B Arch course and is folded into everything we learn and produce. Constructi accounts for a great deal of carbon emissions internationally. Architects are generally the design lead and therefore, are responsible

sustainable materials and techniques whilst guiding the client accordingly. In Barbados, I believe that architects can push for that adaptive rouse of our existing older buildings, greater use of efficient water pursuit of renewable energy sources. especially in domestic projects.

What advice would you give to another young Barbadian who is now setting off overseas to pursue studies away from home? If you have not had the opportunity to travel

internationally before, prepare for a culture shock. Luckily, this does not last very long; just be oponed to trying new things.

Secondly, if you are ever feeling down, never crawl into a self-made hole. Reach out to even a school counsellor. Finally, avail of the sources that your respective university offer I have learnt that lecturers are there for you ne matter what, so never hide away.

Covid-19 lessons away from home

eld when she left Barbades in 2019 to pursue a BSc in Architecture at the Dublin Institute of Technology in Ireland. Pile is the first recipient of the Louis Campion Scholarship which supports scholars in their pursuit of excellence in the architecture engineering and construction industry. The scholarship was awarded by her employer Barbados-based architectural practice Argo Development Studio.

In the first part of this two-part interview with the BARBADOS BUSINESS AUTHORITY, Pile shares her experience of studying and living away from home during the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic, Ireland's similarities with Barbados, as well as some lessons from Ireland

How would you describe your experience in Ireland pre-COVID-19? My pre-COVID-19 experience was a rather

short one but quite a few great memories were made. I arrived at the beginning of September 2019 and got straight down to learning my way around Dublin's city centre by foot. The streets were bursting and lively, and people took advantage of the last long summer days before layering up - a task that I hilariously trialed and errored with for the first few weeks.

I shared a small house with other

I married a main mouse was other international students, mainly from Spain, and I got to brush up on my rusty Spanish. Later, I moved out and my good friend from Barbados visited me in October We decided to take a day trip by train and galivanted in Belfast, Northern Ireland – plenty of amazing firsts. I also get the opportunity to take a class trip to Stockholm, Sweden in January My pre-COVID-19 experience in Ireland had brought me an amazing small circle of friends, and an opportunity to physically experience Dublin as a "tourist" and university

How has the pandemic changed life for you there, especially as you pursue your degree?

The transition to life in leghdown did not seem too daunting at first. I thought, like most people, that it would only last for two weeks, maybe a month, the most. As a student, I did my best to adapt and change my home environment into a more productive space. Overtime I realised that studying and sturing at four walls for most of my day was akin to solitary confinement and my mental health

was waning. My work-life balance was also off-kilter Despite this I learned to cope with my circumstances. Zoom lectures be the norm, new communication and time nanagement skills were honed, as well as interesting ways of visually presenting thoughts and ideas. It's quite hizarre to think that December 2019 was the last time I physically presented in front of my lecturers until February of this year. It was nerve-

What do you like most about Ireland? I appreciate little quirks about Irish people at least the ones that I've observed and racted with. They tend to always say sorry for the smallest things, for example, apologising before initiating a conversation or apologising after accidentally broading you in a shop or on the street. This leads me to say that Irish people are generally very friendly and approachable. My landlords are an Irish and arbadian couple, and every interaction feels

What do you miss most about Barbados?

I miss my family most, hands down, especially mum and dad. We have a very close-knit and supportive relationship. I adore the summ that I've had thus far to return home and enship. I adore the summers

Are there any similarities between Barbados and Ireland?

The Irish love their pubs and the camaraderie within - it reminds me somewhat of people gathering at rum shops in Burbades. We also share unique vocabulary - my ears instantly pricked up when first hearing it. Additionally, I've learned that certain Barbadian surnames originated from the Irish. Once like Forde, Gill, Manning, Fitzgerald, Fitzpatrick, Kirton, O'Neale and O'Brien are among a few These are a result of history when in the 17th century thousands of Irish people were shipped to Barbados as indentured servants and slaves They were seen by the British as a lower race and were treated with the same cruelty as African slaves, Consequently, the Irish and African slaves would often conspire to rebellion More was learned from reading a book called To Hell Or Barbados by Sean O' Callaghan.

Is there anything that Ireland does well that you think Barbados could benefit

I believe that Barbadas could benefit from the prioritisation of dependably scheduled, energy-efficient public transportation over the influx of private vehicles. Ireland is by no means the best example in the European Union, but the difference is stark and something that I've come to appreciate while here.

In addition to this, I have observed a greater use of pedestrian routes, as well as, public spaces and amenities, especially for exercise.

Lots of people here get out for a run or a simple walk, especially with their dops. Lots of people are enrolled in gyms. Fortunately, I believe that there has been an increase in individuals who prioritise their health in Barbados. I would say that the pandemic was a cutalyst for myseli

The master planning design work undertaken by ARGO assisted FYH in setting a strategy for all future development work at the hotel. ARGO used its Building Information Modelling (BIM) software to construct a virtual model of the hotel, including a detailed 3D model of the historic remains of the old fort, which helped my team and I to fully appreciate the challenges and opportunities at hand.

The direction of our brief took an unexpected turn when Hurricane Maria made landfall in Dominica on September the 18th, 2017. ARGO was then asked to turn its attention to all areas damaged by the hurricane and to redesign where opportunities existed in areas such as the pool deck, pool bar, waterfront, new hotel entrance, Warner's Bar and the Palisades Restaurant. ARGO was also asked to provide Management Contracting services to lead the recovery effort, which saw a successful delivery to a very aggressive timeline.

The largest undertaking to date by ARGO was to rescue, reinvent and redesign the existing restaurant-Palisades. Our vision was to transform this into a destination fine-dining restaurant with an extended external terrace to facilitate 120 seats, an internal restaurant serving 60 seats and a bar with both a private dining option and an open-air, bar lounge offering. The new restaurant design was informed by the rich heritage and culture of Dominica and was to have a sense of place about it. ARGO was also asked to deliver this project through Management Contracting and we are delighted with the result and feel the restaurant was completed to an award-winning standard.

We are continuing to work through the next elements of the masterplan for Fort Young Hotel with ARGO, which includes a new 60-room hotel block, courtyard, reception and Marguis refurbishment works, along with new conference facilities.
